



# 8 Areas of Ministry

## Ministry Overview

Mosaic Community's areas of ministry are reflective of the vision and focus of those in our body as well as the needs within our body and the community around us.

- Generational Ministries** provide mentorship and discipleship for our children from birth through high school, and extending to our collegiate community.

- Body Ministries** provide support to our members as a whole, under girding and strengthening our covenant relationships.

- Community Ministries** focus on extending the love of Christ to the community around us through practical and creative means.

Our areas of ministry are fluid, and change and adapt as the Holy Spirit shapes our collective vision to best meet the needs in our body and the community that surrounds us.

## GENERATIONAL Ministries

### Chi Alpha College Ministry

Chi Alpha College Ministry is a movement of college-age men and women who meet together each week on the campus of Oklahoma State University. Chi Alpha gatherings are informal, infused with music and interaction, and cover topics that are relevant to college life. As a ministry, Chi Alpha is committed to providing an atmosphere where students encounter God through salvation, healing, and the baptism in the Holy Spirit, where they can connect with each other and build lifelong

relationships, and where they are challenged to grow in their faith through discipleship and small groups. The group's mission is to mentor students as they reach out to the campus community, and to prepare college students to become ministers in the marketplace following their graduations.

### Revolution Youth Ministry

Revolution Youth Ministry focuses on students who are 12-18 years old. The group is committed to seeing the youth of our city transformed 360 degrees from lives of brokenness to lives of wholeness in Christ. Revolution met weekly for small group gatherings throughout the summer and the leadership of Mosaic Community is currently seeking God's direction for the future structure of the group.

### Generation 228 Discipleship (Children's Ministry)

The name "Generation 228" is derived from Joel 2:28—"And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh; your sons and daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions." This verse expresses what we believe God is doing among our body and especially our children. He is pouring himself upon us...pressing our children into deeper levels of knowledge, understanding, and intimacy. Generation 228 *Discipleship* exists to mentor and equip our children from 3-12 years old to embrace this outpouring of God's Spirit and become true disciples of Christ and valuable members of our church body. Generation 228 celebrates the uniqueness of each of our children, cultivating their spiritual giftings through times of discipleship and prayer. We are committed to

developing spiritual maturity in our children by equipping them with truth from the Word and practical tools for applying it in the world around them. The group meets each Sunday during the adult worship service and throughout the year for times of fellowship and service to the community.

## Baby and Toddler Nursery

The Baby and Toddler Nursery provides loving care for infants from birth to two years old during our corporate worship gathering each Sunday. Nursery volunteers pray for our babies and toddlers and are committed to providing a safe environment where our children can learn and grow.

## BODY Ministries

### PODS

Mosaic Community meets weekly for large group gatherings on Sunday mornings. PODs (Places of Discipleship) are smaller and more intimate gatherings throughout the week for the purposes of fellowship, discipleship, and relationship building. The PODs offered through Mosaic Community change with the needs of our body and the vision of our leaders.

### Worship Ministry

The vision of the Mosaic Community Worship Ministry is to lead our body in worshipping God in spirit and truth (John 4:23). It is our desire that people from all backgrounds will come into the manifest presence of God and be changed. We trust the Holy Spirit to move among us and rely on His prophetic voice to bring us closer to the face of God. We value unity, humility, servanthood, commitment, and purity, and are committed to times of prayer, practice, and fellowship with each other. We believe the spirit and the power of God can and will transform our lives and the lives of others in our community (2 Cor. 3:18). ## COMMUNITY Ministries

### Christo's Community

Christo's Community is a food distribution ministry for those in need in Stillwater and has been providing food to Stillwater area families for more than seven years. In the past year, Christo's Community has served over 150 families in its bi-monthly distributions. The mission of Christo's Community is to provide food for families in need in Stillwater and the surrounding area, sharing our lives with the people we serve, and expressing God's love in a tangible way to those who need it most. Christo's Community distributes food the second Wednesday of every other month (February, April, June, August, October, and December) beginning at 7:00 pm at Mosaic Community.

### Covenant Community School

Covenant Community School serves the community of Stillwater by providing a Christ-centered educational alternative for families who desire for their children to learn and grow in harmony with the Word of God. CCS views itself as a partner with the Christian homes and evangelical churches of the community, completing a triangle of Godly influence for our children.
